MAYOR'S MESSAGE

This is the first newsletter under the new Council. I'm very pleased about the way our Council is working together for the benefit of our community.

The financial position of the Council is in surplus. We have a significant program of projects and grants that will be of great benefit for the community as well.

For the first time, we have a \$16M approved forward roads program for the next 2 years. This means that there will not be any delays in commencing our road works straight after the wet.

We have a forward program of community house building which includes the 5 bedroom duplex houses in Lardil St, a number of plugins for the community, the single men's units, the 13 lot housing development opposite the airport.

We are close to completing the tavern with a liquor licence to open it everyday. A café will soon open at the airport, and our first footpath has been completed, with more on the way. Our new library will be completed prior to Christmas, and the youth hub is now operating. We also have \$4.5M to protect against erosion and to upgrade the barge area.


A great community improvement includes the free phone and internet currently being installed in every house and building in the township with Australian Government funding.


I am very proud to be trusted with the with the responsibility of being your mayor at a time when there are great things planned for the community.

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT


Council's Animal Management Team will be out and about from the **23 September to 4 October** administering flea, tick and worming tablets to all dogs and cats.

PLEASE REMEMBER: All animals should be properly secured at all times. Dangerous dogs can be surrendered to Council. Any animal incidents can be reported to Council, too.

Dogs should be kept in yards and not be roaming the streets.

Remember to always have fresh water available for your pets.

GREENING-UP MORNINGTON









Council has been working hard to secure additional funding for a range of projects which will improve the wellbeing and lifestyle for community members. Some projects include:

NIAA NAIDOC week celebrations grant: \$40,000 from the Australian Government National Indigenous Australians Agency for community activities including an elders' dinner, a range of activities for kids, adults and senior citizens, as well as breakfasts, barbeques, tee shirts and more!

Queensland Goverment Department of Treaty, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Paertneships, Communities and the Arts Community Emergency Help Funds which provided food and meat vouchers to the value of \$75 for each household.

Gulf Trust (QLD Cares) have provided \$11,000 for a new inflatable water slide for community youth which will ensure hours of water play and fun activities for children.

The NAB-foundation provided \$35,000 for greening-up Gununa, Mornington Island. Citrus trees, t-shirts and a barbeque was rolled out during August 2024. More trees with these funds will be planted around the community including at the school and at the Visitor Accommodation Centre, shortly.

The Community Gambling Trust has provided \$85,000 for a twelve seat bus. The bus will display local artist creations and is due to arrive on island by Christmas.

Orange Sky Laundry has arrived on island and will commence services with three washing machines and 3 dryers for community use. Orange Sky will be accessible at the Salvation Army opportunity shop location in Lardil Street, from October 2024.

Get Ready Queensland Program has provided \$6,780 for community and cyclone season preparation with tools and equipment including electric lawn mowers, brush cutters and leaf blowers.

The Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal has provided \$10,000 as a part of the strengthening Rural communities program to purchase library books for the new Library scheduled to open during early 2025.

Queensland Resilience and Risk Reduction Fund has provided \$709,000 for the important purchase of a 60,000L Opal fuel tank, as well as a back up freezer/fridge at barge landing with a generator to provide food and fuel security for up to 2 weeks during a cyclone or other natural disaster event.

BUILDING AND WORKS AROUND GUNUNA

HOUSING AND FACILITIES

Extensive house painting works continue to occur. More than twenty homes are now looking fresh, with modern colour schemes. More than twenty homes are a part of a painting works schedule, too.

ENGINEERING

- Council now has \$6m in total from two different funding sources for a new water treatment plant. Until then, a boil water alert will remain in place for all tap water.
- Council will be cleaning all stormwater drains before the wet season.
- The team is also putting firebreaks in place at the moment.
- A sewage upgrade is happening on island at the moment to ensure better odour management.
- Footpath works will be extended east along Lardil Street to the hospital in the new year.
- Womald is on island this week servicing all of the fire extinguishers at Council sites and in Council vehicles.
- Waste management planning continues. In the new year new tip operations and an improved recycling centre will be rolled out.

OTHER NEWS

- \$4.82 initial payment of a \$16 million roads funding through QRA received.
- This week Visitor Accommodation Centre and motel accommodation has been at 100% occupancy. This demonstrates the need for additional motel and Visitor Accommodation Centre rooms. Planning is underway for exciting prefabrication on the island of additional motel buildings. In time this will present training and professional development for locals related to construction and engineering.

BACKYARD FIRES ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

Thinking of having a small open fire? Have some garden waste to burn? Always **CONTACT MORNINGTON RFS** before lighting your fire.

You can contact Steve Williams directly 0474 304 347 or alternatively call the SES Hotline on 132500.

You should check the weather forecast prior to lighting to ensure the current and forecast conditions will not be outside those prescribed by the Rural Fire Service Warden. You cannot control the weather, but by checking the conditions, you have the best chance of adhering to the requirements RFS.

The fire cannot be lit if the wind exceeds 15 kph. These conditions must apply throughout the duration of the fire.

There are a number of useful weather sites on the internet, some of which provide daily forecasts (up to four days ahead) showing the temperature, relative humidity and wind strength and direction. A good site to obtain a general weather forecast for your area is <u>Bureau of Meteorology</u>.

If your fire escapes from the planned boundaries of the fire or gets out of control in any way, your obligations (under the Act) are to:

- Take all reasonable steps to extinguish or control the fire; and
- As soon as is practicable, report the existence and location of the fire by calling 000 (triple zero).
- If you are at all concerned about the behaviour of the fire, act early.

It is your responsibility to ensure the fire you light does not affect other persons, properties or the environment.

How long do I supervise the fire?

You need to supervise the fire for as long as necessary to ensure it doesn't escape. The Permit to Light Fire states: "After burning, the perimeter of the burn must be made safe and the fire patrolled until there is no longer any risk of the fire escaping" You can cease patrolling when the burnt area is cool, with no remaining heat source.

CARRIAGE



CARRIAGE LIMIT QUESTIONS ANSWERED

Do you know how much alcohol you can have with you? What if you're in a car with other people? And where can it be consumed? It's also important to understand the conditions Council has abide by to meet licence conditions. Read this information to help answer these questions and more!

Carriage Limit

- Carriage limit is 30 cans of mid strength alcohol, not more than 4%;
- The carriage limit is per person or per vehicle;
 - This means only one individual carriage limit in a vehicle, plane landing at the airport, boat landing onshore etc.
 - More than one person cannot get in a car with their carriage limit. The only
 exception is the Council bus with a restricted area permit that allows only
 that bus to carry adult passengers with their individual carriage limits;

Licence conditions

- The licensee (Council) cannot:
 - charge more than the retail price for any alcohol ordered through the Barge Shed;
 - o charge freight costs above the total freight costs incurred by council;
 - o sell liquor to any person who has not paid for the alcohol;
- Barge Shed can only supply the carriage limit of liquor per person per day to a nominated person;
- You CANNOT drink at the Barge Shed;
- Council must organise monthly meetings with the Community Justice Group, the OIC of the Mornington Police Station and OLGR;
- Council must have a courtesy bus to take residents home;
- Council must ensure that home delivery is an option available where practical.
